UBC GUEST AND NEW MEMBER ROWING RULES

Guest Rowing

- UBC Members who host a non-member/guest on a row ("Host") must acquaint the guest with UBC boat use and log-in/out procedures.
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- Offering guests the use of his/her private equipment. No keys should be given to non-members.
- We Hosts should log guest miles as "G" for Guest in logbook. (Place a "G" before the Guest's name when entering line-up in the computer log.
- @ Guests may row up to 50 total miles per year. After that, the Guest must be a Candidate in order to row additional miles. A Guest becomes a Candidate once a Membership Application and related forms have been submitted to the Elective Committee. Candidate miles should be logged separately as "C" in the computer log. (See Admission Process Guidelines)
- The UBC Host member lending the equipment must accompany the Guest.
- Most-guest crews must be composed of 50% UBC members.
- We Host-guest crews should be bowed by the UBC member, unless accepted by the Club Coxswain.
- @ The Executive Committee has the discretion to make special provision re: dues, equipment use, etc. for out-of-town persons who are resident in Philadelphia for a temporary duration and who are not Guests or Candidates for Active Membership.

New Member Rowing

- New members are responsible to adhere to UBC boat use and logging procedures. University Barge Club Rules may be found on the UBC website or next to the log station. The appearance of "*" next to a log entry generally indicates a breach of those procedures. Please note related comments by Club Coxswain.
- New members who are novice rowers may not bring rowing Guests until they have rowed at least 500 miles in Class 3 or 4 equipment (gigs), or have achieved a Class 2 skill level of sculling a single shell competently (as determined by Club Coxswain).
- New members who are experienced rowers must first have logged 250 miles out of UBC or been an active rowing member for at least one year before bringing rowing Guests.
